• Rob Wellington Quigley, an Architect based in San Diego, California well-known for contemporary solutions for social housing. His 202 Island Inn, a single room occupancy hotel, was selected by Time as one of the "Ten Best Designs of 1992" and received a national AIA Honor Award. In recent years, he has completed a number of public buildings, social housing and community mixed use projects.
