Construction Industry Consultative Committee Terms of Reference

1.0 Composition

The Construction Industry Consultative Committee (CICC) shall consist of the chief elected and senior staff officers of the following national organizations:

- Association of Consulting Engineers of Canada (ACEC);
- Canadian Construction Association (CCA):
- Construction Specifications Canada (CSC); and
- Royal Architectural Institute of Canada (RAIC).

2.0 Role and Mandate

- 2.1 To consult on matters of mutual concern.
- 2.2 To provide a forum for the exchange of information, views and policy positions on issues and subject matters of general and specific interest to the construction industry.
- 2.3 To identify issues and subject matters on which a common position exists or might exist.
- 2.4 To consider possible joint initiatives on specific issues to achieve mutually desirable objectives.
- 2.5 To avoid the expression of contrary views to government and others on issues of mutual concern.
- 2.6 To achieve, where possible, a single, unified voice on specific issues affecting the industry.
- 2.7 To oversee and direct the activities of the Canadian Construction Documents Committee (CCDC).
- 2.8 To promote the use of CCDC Standard Documents.
- 2.9 To appoint, renew or discontinue (as applicable) CCDC's owner representatives and ex-officio members, on the recommendation of the CCDC.

3.0 Meetings

The CICC will meet on an annual basis or more frequently at the request of a member organisation.

Meetings of the senior staff officers may be convened to further the objectives of the Committee.

4.0 Chairmanship of Meetings

The annual meeting of the CICC will be chaired by an elected officer from one of the member organizations. Chairmanship will rotate among the member groups.

5.0 Secretary

The Executive Secretary to the CCDC shall serve as the Secretary for the CICC.
