In each project he searches for the often unrealized potential and then with his continued involvement in the working drawings and on site construction ensures that the design is built without compromise.

Peter has an ability to work successfully with his clients to understand all aspects of their programme from the functional to the often unexpressed aspirations for the role of the building in the community. His hands on approach, together with the support of a skilled team, ensures that the design will be considered at the forefront of its type and will reflect a progressive and proud community.

Peter is also active in the development of the city having twice been Chairman of the City of Vancouver Urban Design panel, made up of members of related professions together with City Planning officials to review all major projects in the downtown.

He has also taught as an adjunct professor at the University of British Columbia, the University of Calgary, Washington State University, the University of Texas at Austin, and has lectured extensively in North and South America and in Europe.


