# RAIC Advocate for Architecture Award Terms of Reference

Edited by the RAIC Awards Advisory Committee July 2022 Approved by RAIC Board of Directors, July 2022

## 1. Purpose

This award celebrates an individual, or collective of individuals, who has made a significant public contribution to the advancement of Canadian architecture through their advocacy, patronage, and/or other forms of support. Candidates may include clients or patrons, educators, public servants, architects, allied professions and others. It considers exemplary approaches to sustainability; and the support and advancement of equity, diversity, and inclusion. The award recognizes long-term commitment to the profession at an international, national, regional or local level.

# 2. Eligibility

Any individual or collective of individuals is eligible for this award.

## 3. Call for Nominations

Nominations can be made by one or more members of the RAIC. Previous nominees may be renominated.

#### 4. Submission Materials

The following items must be completed or provided:

- 1. A nomination form signed by the nominator;
- 2. A current résumé of the nominee(s);
- 3. A maximum three-page report summarizing the activities of the individual, demonstrating their ongoing advocacy for architects and/or architecture;
- 4. A minimum of three letters of support from architects, academics, cultural critics, and/or others familiar with the nominee's work specific to this nomination;
- 5. A maximum 200-word abstract summarizing the submission, provided in English and/or French;
- 6. Relevant supporting material, such as awards, publications, etc., and up to ten images (optional);
- 7. A completed image index, providing captions and full credit information for each image (if applicable).

#### 5. Selection Process



The RAIC Awards Advisory Committee shall appoint a jury each year. The judging process, led by a professional advisor, shall reflect the RAIC's values throughout. The number of jurors may vary from year to year.

## 6. Number of Awards

One award will be conferred. At its discretion, the jury may elect not to confer an award.

# 7. Frequency

The award is to be offered every year.

## 8. Public Presentation

The Advocate for Architecture Award will be presented at a public event.
